Jesus is my Savior from the World

"In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." John 16:33

Do you struggle in life? Are there days when it seems like you're under siege on all sides? Do you wish someone would save you from your family problems? From your health issues? From mistakes you've made and events you regret but can't change? In this world, everyone needs a savior from something. What, or who, do you need a savior from?

Jesus tells us that he is the Savior: "In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world." Maybe at first glance that seems like a somewhat simplistic thing for Jesus to say. How could he possibly hope to cover all the potential issues that could come up in the lives of his disciples in their world, to say nothing of ours today? Jesus overcame all of that sin when he lived the perfect and sinless life that God demands. Jesus overcame all that sin when he laid down his perfect life at the cross and died—even though he didn't deserve it. Now you and I can overcome the world too by putting ourselves aside and placing our trust and reliance in Jesus. He leads us through the hardest of times and finally will take us home to his world—the kingdom of heaven he has prepared for all who believe in him.

With Thanksgiving upon us, there's no denying that Christmas is right around the corner! One easy way to wrap up your gift shopping is to buy Scrip cards. With more than 700 retailers that participate in the Scrip program, there's sure to be something for everyone.

Are you on your way to Grandma's for Christmas? We have BP and Kwik Trip cards that can *fuel* your trip.

And don't forget about the holiday cooking and baking! We have cards from several area grocers in stock so you can purchase all the ingredients you need to whip up your delicious meals and tasty treats.

If you need to order a Scrip card that is not in stock, the deadline to order for Christmas is **December 13**th **at 3:00 pm**. Pending inclement weather (which delays shipments), we would then have cards ready for pickup by Friday afternoon, December 16. You would then have until the morning of Wednesday, December 21st to pick up your order.

Sales times are at school on Monday-Friday 7:45-8:15 AM and Wednesday-Friday 2:45-3:15 PM. Periodically, there will also be sales in the Fellowship Hall on Sundays 9:00 to 9:15 AM (just before Bible Study). In addition, Scrip cards will be available for purchase at Zion's home basketball games. The only home game in December will be Friday, December 16th. When paying in person, checks are the only form of payment. If you want to shop using a credit card, you can do so online at www.shopwithcrip.com. A password is required to shop online and can be requested from the Scrip representatives at Zion.

Scrip cards are a true win-win -- by purchasing Scrip cards, you are benefiting the Christian education of your children/grandchildren/family members and supporting the ministry of Zion Lutheran School.

Elders Board

What does God want from us?
We know we are saved by
grace alone. There is nothing
we can do to even assist in our
salvation. It is by grace alone
through faith in Christ Jesus



alone. Yet, we were created to do good works: For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. (Ephesians 2:10) and faith without deeds is dead. (James 2:26b). So, what could be some of those works? How about repenting? For I take no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Sovereign LORD. Repent and live! (Ezekiel 18:32) and "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near." (Matthew 3:2) But unless you repent, you too will all perish. (Luke 13:3) Sounds to me like he wants us to repent and live!

Let's see if he wants us to encourage. *Therefore encourage one another with these words.* (1 Thessalonians 4:18) or *that is, that you and I may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith.* (Romans 1:12) It is great encouragement when we gather together in worship and study.

Maybe he just wants us to do something so simple it's only two letters, g and o...GO! Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19) He said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation. (Mark 16:15)

Why does he want this from us? It is because he wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth. (1 Timothy 2:4) It's not necessarily easy work. In fact, if we stray from the word of God, it becomes almost impossible.

I would like to quote from my devotional book for this year <u>Stories of Faith and Courage from the Korean War</u> by Larkin Spivey:

My father's favorite quote was from Robert E. Lee: "Duty is the sublimest word in the English language." Sublime used this way means "exalted and awe inspiring." Lee used this word to denote the transcendent nature of our moral obligations or those things we are called to do by virtue of our positions in life. We know what they are. Our duties as husband, father, employee, and church member are usually clear.

It is seldom difficult to know the right thing to do.

Unfortunately, the right thing we are supposed to do is not always the easiest. The apostle Paul wrestled with the dilemma of knowing what to do and not being able to do it. He described a war within himself: "When I want to do good, evil is right there with me. For in my inner being I delight in God's law; but I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind" (Romans 7:21-23). Realizing his human weakness and inability to do what he knew he should on his own, Paul sought a higher and greater strength: What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God – through Jesus Christ our Lord! (Romans 7:24-25).

Let's hear, read, study, and take to heart the words of Scripture, repent of our sins, encourage each other, and then let's go and tell others about their Savior!

Proposed Bylaw Change

Whereas our Family Ministry Board was eliminated and;

Whereas we created many new committees when we came to our current building and;

Whereas those committees have no council voice or representation or guidance and;

Whereas those committees are doing much of what the former Family Ministry Board used to do;

Therefore, be it resolved that we re-instate the Family Ministry Board and have the chairman be a member of the Church Council per the following changes and additions.

Article IV

Section 6

Change Section 6 to read: (change in *italics and underlined*):

"Family Ministry Board

- 1. The Family Ministry Board shall consist of at least three voting members including the chairman. The Church Council shall appoint the members for three year terms.
- 2. This board shall establish and maintain active programs to serve and meet the spiritual and educational needs of the congregation at large and specifically of youth, married couples, parents with children, singles, members temporarily away from home, and those with special needs. It shall consult with other congregations and with synod to learn what programs have been effective elsewhere and what materials are available to enhance family life and shall make these resources available to the members of the congregation. It shall prepare annual budget recommendations for those items of the congregation's business of which it is responsible.
- 3. This board is accountable to the Church Council and shall report to it through the board chairman.

Article IV

Add (addition in *italics and underlined*):

Section 7

Board Vacancies

The Church Council shall fill vacancies occurring on any of these boards through appointment.

This addition used to be section 6

Article III

Section 1

Paragraph 1


Change (change in *italics and underlined*) the last sentence to:

"The church council will consist of a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and a Chairman for each of the following board: Stewardship, Elders, Education, Property Management, Outreach and *Family Ministry*.

Make this yummy treat to give to family and friends at Christmas,




What you need:
