Reminders to Love

Reminders! We need reminders! We write notes to ourselves so we don't forget something. Perhaps we list things to do or to take with us so we

something. Perhaps we list things to do or to take with us so we don't forget anything. We keep calendars with dates marked for important meetings and events.

Our faith needs reminders too. Not just because we are forgetful but also because a part within us still doesn't want to do what we know we should. Even the apostle Paul had trouble from time to time. He wrote, "I have the desire to do what is good, but I cannot carry it out. For what I do is not the good I want to do; no, the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing" (Romans 7:18,19). The reason he didn't always do what God wanted was because sin was living in him (v. 20).

When it comes to putting our love into action, we are faced with the same challenge. We want to come and worship. We want to live as God's people in this world. We desire to bring our offerings to the Lord. All these things show our love for Jesus. But we sometimes don't. We let other things become more important.

We need reminders to live as God's people and to let our love show by our actions, as we are gentle, kind, compassionate, and faithful. We will need reminders from time to time that we are God's people and we love Jesus because he first loved us. Then we

can overcome the sinful nature that still lives within us and troubles us.

When we think we don't need to come to worship with our fellow believers, we need a reminder: do not give up coming together to worship God and to encourage one another. The reminder is important because coming to worship God not only gives us a chance to show our love for God but also to receive his comfort and strength for our journey through life.

We need reminders about our offerings too. God encourages us to excel in the grace of giving (2 Corinthians 8:7). Paul reminds us to set aside a sum of money in keeping with our incomes (1 Corinthians 16:2). We are to give as much as we are able out of love for Christ. Our gifts show our love and gratitude. It's love in action!

These reminders come so that our love for the Lord will not grow cold or lukewarm. We do love the Lord. He has shown his love for us in giving us eternal blessings. He simply asks that we show our love for him by our actions each day.

Elders Board by Jeff Krakow

The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction. (Proverbs 1:7)

Whoever fears the LORD walks uprightly, but those who despise him are devious in their ways. (Proverbs 14:2)

No one can serve two masters. Either you will hate the one and love the other, or you will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money. (Matthew 6:24)

A friend pointed out to me that he saw two stickers on one truck, "I'd rather be deer hunting" and "I'd rather be turkey hunting". It made him think, would anyone have a bumper sticker that read "I'd rather be in church"?

As I was driving around, I saw a billboard that read:

If You Died Today

HEAVEN? or HELL?

In the above verses, God tells us to fear Him. That is, respect or know Him, gain knowledge of Him. That can only be done by the power of the Holy Spirit through Word and Sacrament. To despise His Word, to ignore it or put other things first such as hunting turkeys or deer, is to brand you a fool or make you devious in your ways. Don't get me wrong, God also gave us the blessings of hunting and fishing. It is when you put hunting, fishing, golfing, going to the cabin etc. in place of your worship that leads you to foolishness and temptations of devious ways. God also tells us you cannot serve both God and money, you will either hate the one and love the other or be devoted to the one and despise the other, if serving the LORD seems undesirable to you, then choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve. (Joshua 24:15a) As you ponder my last statement, ponder Mark's writings also; Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength. (12:30); Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever

does not believe will be condemned. (16:16) and never ever forget God's perfect plan for our salvation that we read in John 3:16 For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life.

God gave His Son to take on the sins of the world so the punishment of sin would be paid. All of your sins, all of my sins, the ones we have committed and the ones we will yet commit, are paid for. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. (2 Corinthians 5:21) That is a love that is not easily understood. Meditate on His Word at home, on the road, wherever you may be. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.

Dear Gracious Father,

We so often take that love for granted and follow our old Adam of selfishness by keeping the blessings you give us for ourselves instead of following you through the new man of faith you created in us. Psalm 144:15 says, "Blessed [or happy] are the people whose God is the LORD." Make these bright cupcakes to remember all the ways God makes you happy.




What you need:

Construction on our new church is nearing completion. What an exciting time! Since our last Q and A we have received some more questions. So, once again, in an effort to clearly communicate what's going on with our building project, the Building Committee has drafted this Q and A document. We pray that you will find it helpful. Please feel free to contact any member of the Building Committee with any questions you may have. Their contact information is listed at the end of this document.

When will we dedicate the new building?

Making the move to a new building is always a little tricky. When will the building be finished? When will we be granted occupancy? As of this writing we are shooting for September 14 as the building completion date. Assuming all things go according to plan, we will bid farewell to the old church on September 14 or 21. We will then move into the new building on September 21 or 28. Dedication is set for Sunday, October 26 in services at 8:00 and 10:30am. Why wait so long to dedicate? Having a few weeks in the new building will allow us to get used to the space and work out any bugs. We will need to tweak the sound system, figure out ushering procedures, etc. Then will be



ready to dedicate without as many distractions. With a little sadness but much more thankfulness, we will say farewell to a building that has served us for more than 130 years. With great joy we will move into a new building that, God willing, will serve God's people for generations to come.

When will the community get to see the new building?

The people of Columbus are, of course, welcome to worship with us anytime. Every Sunday is an open house! However, special open houses have been planned for Saturday, October 18 from 9:00am until noon, and Sunday, November 2 from noon to 3:00pm. These days were chosen because they don't conflict with Badger or Packer games. Citizens of Columbus and members of area WELS churches will enjoy light refreshments, tours of the church and free commemorative gifts. Activities for children are also being planned. What special days these will be! Please old crucifix, lovingly restored by our chancel artist, Nathan watch for more details in the near future.

What's the special gifts brochure all about?

A number of needed items are not covered under the construction budget. We have already made you aware of

special projects for the stained glass windows, bell and organ. We are also looking for special gifts to cover a number of furnishings and other special items such as a hearing loop (to assist the hearing impaired), tables and chairs for the fellowship hall, and pieces of the chancel ensemble (cross with



figure of Christ, baptismal font, altar, pulpit, triptych, paintings), and others. Gifts may be given in memory of a loved one, to commemorate a special occasion, or simply to give thanks to our gracious Lord for the gift of salvation. Copies of the brochure are available on the information table in church or from the office up at school. Gifts will be noted in a special book that will be on display in our new church library. Many gifts have already been received (thank you!), but many more are needed. Please consider giving a gift over and above your regular offerings and building fund commitments.

What will happen with the old baptismal font?

Our current baptismal font is a neat piece of our history, a gift from the 1887 confirmation class. How many babies have received the washing of rebirth and renewal in that font? As precious as the old font is, it won't really fit well with our new chancel ensemble. However, we think we have found a way to commemorate the history and importance of the old font. We plan to put it on display in the back of the new church. Hanging above it will be the Pope. As worshipers enter the sanctuary the first thing they will see on the wall straight ahead will be the old font and crucifix. As they turn to go to their seats they will see the newly restored stained glass windows. In other words, to enter the new church one will need to, in a sense, pass through the old. This will help us to retain a real connection to our congregation's history and hang on to precious memories of the old church. Much planning has gone into our new worship space. How are we doing with our commitments?

Some have wondered if we are keeping up with our commitments for the building project. Happily, the answer is a resounding Yes. In 2012, \$103,900 in initial special gifts 623.2462 | brucerzander@gmail.com were given, along with \$42,952 in commitments collected. In 2013 we received \$244,891.05. So far in 2014 we have received \$114, 677.83. The grand total of commitments already received is \$506,420.88. This puts us well on track to reach the \$852,941 dollars pledged. God's people are faithfully bringing gifts in thanks for his love. What a joy that is to see! To God alone be all the glory!

Will we have a cornerstone?

We looked into placing a cornerstone in the new church, but there just really isn't a good place to put it. It will make more sense to place a cornerstone as part of phase 2 of the project – the construction of the new school.

Why the new logo?

Our current logo, featuring the old crucifix at the front of the chancel, was part of our 150th anniversary celebration in 2008. Since we are moving into a new building, it seemed like the right time to make a change. Our new logo keys on the name of our congregation. The name Zion is common in the Scriptures. In the Psalms, Zion often describes the Temple Mount built on a hill in Jerusalem where God dwelt among his people and where they gathered to worship him. For this reason, the term "Mount Zion" is often used. This is also why the logo features mountains. By extension, Zion can mean Jerusalem, Israel, and in the New Testament, God's people

here and in eternity - in other words, the Holy Christian Church, where God is graciously present through the Gospel in Word and Sacrament. A lot of time and effort was put into designing the new logo. We hope you like it!
