JESUS IS NOT RETIRED

It must be great to be retired! No clock to punch. No schedule. No obligations. You get to do whatever you want every day. Sleep in. Lie in the hammock. Read a book. Watch a movie. Sit in your rocking chair and sip lemonade. Whatever.

OK. That's not what it's really like to be retired. Most retired people will tell you that they are busier than ever. Watching the grandkids. Volunteering in the community. Projects at church and at home. Sometimes retired people are so busy that they barely have time for a vacation, much less a nap.

Some people think that when Jesus ascended to heaven he retired. With his mission of saving mankind complete, there was nothing left for him to do. So he just sort of rode off into the sunset. Isn't it wonderful to know that we don't do this alone? Jesus sends the Spirit to empower us for the task.

Our ascended Lord is planning to return. Angels made this clear: "This same Jesus, who has been taken away from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven" (Acts 1:11). Zion Scrip Tuition Rebate Program

Earn money for your family's tuition! Scrip is a way to earn credit towards tuition at Zion, Lakeside Lutheran High School, or Luther Prep School. 50% of your rebate will go to a family member's tuition at one of these schools. Zion's Board of Ed will use the other 50% of the rebate for non budgeted school items at their discretion. No family member attending school? No problem! Zion will still benefit from 100% of your rebate.

The Scrip calendar year runs from July 1st to June 30th, so scrip orders must be made by June 30th to get a tuition incentive for the upcoming 2015-2016 school year.

We will have special Scrip sales hours in the summer at Zion Church between services on **June 28 and July 26!** These two dates will replace all sales and pickups from the Zion office. We will have some items in stock on these dates. You'll need to plan ahead since we'll be placing orders only once a month. For example, if you place an order between May 17th and June 28th, you'll be able to pickup your Scrip cards the following month on July 26th between church services at Zion Church in the fellowship hall. Our normal Monday through Friday sales and pickups will continue through the last day of school and resume with the start of school in August.

Remember that you are still able to place Scrip orders online using ScripNow and PrestoPay throughout the summer. PrestoPay is a payment system linked to your checking account that allows payment to instantly post for your order. ScripNow are the type of cards that are available to print immediately (there are some retailers who do not offer this option). Some retailers also offer ReloadNow. This allows you to add value to plastic cards that were previously purchased through our Scrip program.
