"God is in control and we don't need to worry what will happen."

1. Where did you each grow up? How did you meet and marry?

I (Karen) grew up between Columbus and Beaver Dam on a beef farm. I went to public school through 4th grade and then I transferred to St. Stephen's in Beaver Dam. I went to Lakeside Lutheran for high school. Jim grew up on a dairy farm outside of Columbus and went to public school in Columbus, graduating from Columbus High School. My best friend from Lakeside was from Columbus and she knew guys that were in the same class at CHS. She paired us up to dance together at a polka dance at the pavilion in Fireman's Park. That didn't go so well. We didn't start dating until about 4 months later when we met again at a party that my friend had at her house. We married in October of 1991 at St. Stephen's in Beaver Dam.

2. What do you want people to know about each of your kids?

We have two grown children, Brandon and Alyssa. They both live in Madison so we see them regularly.



3. Someone asks you what you do for a living. What do you tell them?

I have worked at American Packaging Corporation for 25 years. I have been in Corporate Accounting doing payroll, accounts payable and other accounting functions for most of those years. I was recently promoted to Corporate Human Resources as a Total Rewards Specialist where I will be working more with compensation and benefits. 4. What do you enjoy doing when you aren't working?

I sing in the choir at Zion and really enjoy the friendships that I have made over the years. We enjoy

snowmobiling in the winter. In the summer we work on various projects around our farmette and like to go for rides in our convertible.

5. How did you come to be a part of Zion? If you are inviting someone to come to church, what do you tell them?

I went to Sunday School here until we transferred to St. Stephen's in Beaver Dam so my sister & I could go to grade school there. 7. What challenges do you see facing our church in the near future? What do you hope stays the same as time goes on?

I think that it is a challenge to keep our young people strong in their faith so they pass it on to their children. There are so many people in this world that do not want to be told that they are sinners and don't think that they need to ask for forgiveness. There are also so many things that can tear young people away from their faith. I pray that Zion school continues to instill a strong faith in the young people of our congregation for future generations to come.

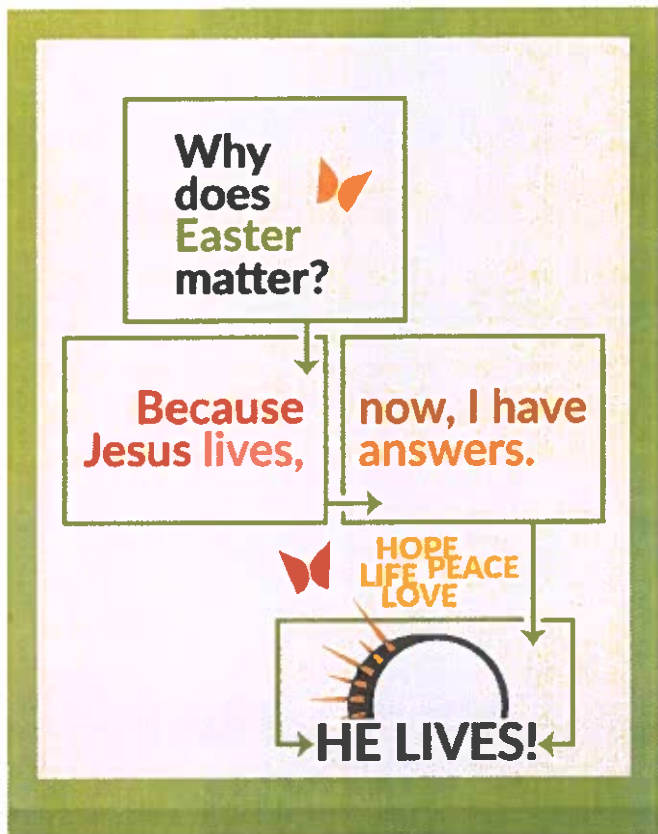
