In Center Time, we finished up our Report Card Assessments. We then reviewed letters Dd and Uu and practiced counting concepts through 10.

During our Theme Time we introduced our study of Arctic Animals. First up is penguins. They mostly live in Antarctica. They are birds that cannot fly, but are great swimmers. We also have two different sensory tubs with Arctic animals that the students have been exploring. They have been extending their play by creating elaborate habitats for these fun animals.

Kindergarten

In Christlight, we reviewed how God can do anything, including using the Israelites' VOICES to knock down a wall. We praise God for using HIS almighty power to help us. We also learned how a man, named Achan, disobeyed God. We pray that God helps us to be content with the blessings we have. The lessons and projects went home on Wednesday and Friday. We started memory work this week. We will have memory work each Thursday that we have school. We learn and practice the memory work at school, but it is a great idea to review the memory work at home as well. The First commandment is due on Thursday. It is printed in the binder as well as in our article each week.

In Superkids we worked on the letter Rr this week. Ask your child what the problem for the Superkids was this week. Each workbook is now two letters, so it will only go home about every other week. The workbook went home today. I strongly encourage you to go through the workbook with your child. Let your child tell you what they did on each page. Encourage them to read the stories found on pages 8-10 and 19-22. Due to the snow days we will start leveled readers **next** week. We will talk about the leveled readers in conferences.

In Math, we started a chapter on addition. We are catching on quickly to the new symbols. We are working on writing our numbers.

In Science we started our unit on Spring. We read a book and discussed what the weather is like in Spring as well as what the weather, animals, and plants do in Spring.

In PE we continued our unit on yoga. We are practicing controlling our bodies, relaxing, breathing, and strengthening our muscles.

Grades 1-2

This week, in Bible History, we learned about God punishing the Israelites for their lack of faith. Korah and his rebellion were punished by God opening up the earth and swallowing them. Then God sent poisonous snakes to bite the unfaithful. He directed Moses to make a snake and put it on a pole. Those who looked at the snake would be healed. This reminds us to look to the cross for the healing of our sins.

In Math the 1st graders have finished the chapter on adding and are starting subtracting. The 2nd graders are working on place value into the hundreds and counting patterns to 1000. We are also comparing numbers in the hundreds.

In Superkids, the 1st graders are continuing to learn about contractions with not. They also learned their memory words for the unit. The 2nd graders are continuing to work on words with double consonants. The 1st graders are writing facts about a topic they know. The 2nd graders are planning a problem and solution story.

In Science, we are continuing to learn about matter. We learned about the 3 states of matter. We talked about physical and chemical changes that happen to matter.

We will also be starting to talk about the Science Fair. We will be doing all of the work in class. We will learn about the Scientific Method. They will be making hypotheses and performing an experiment to test their hypothesis. This should be an exciting experience.

In Art, we learned about warm and cool colors. Then we colored a picture with only warm and cool colors.

Grades 5-6

In Christ-Light this week, we learned about Korah's rebellion. For Faith Foundations, we studied the third and fourth commandments.

6th grade math this week continued working with dividing and multiplying fractions and mixed numbers. 5th grade continues to work on multiplying fractions and mixed numbers. Fractions are a lot easier for students when they know their multiplication and division facts, so practicing those at home is always helpful.

In language arts this week, we reviewed verbs and started on our next writing unit.

In reading, 5th grade read about the history of hot air balloons. We also learned about similes and metaphors. 6th grade continued reading their first novel. *Frindle.*

In Social Studies this week, we continued learning about the countries of Turkey, Israel, Lebanon, and Jordan. We also discussed the conflict in Israel and Palestine and the U.S. presidential election.

We continued learning about waves in science this week. We learned about how ears work and how animals and technologies use sound waves. We also learned about how hearing damage happens.

Music class watched videos about music from Pacific Asia, Australia, and Oceania.

For art this week, we continued working on our winter landscape.

Grades 7-8

In Christ Light, we started a new book, How Can I Make God-Pleasing Decisions. We have discussed spending the money we earn and will continue in our discussions. Pastor Schwartz is teaching Catechism and they are on the 6th and 7th Commandments.

We are starting up Chapter 8 on ratios and angles in Math.

We started the novel, <u>The True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle</u> for Reading. For English we tested on Adjectives and Adverbs. We are continuing our Expository-Problem-Solution unit in Writing.

In Social Studies, we are discussing the geography of the Canada. In Science, we started our topic of Chemistry along with working on our Science Fair projects. We will be going over every aspect of the Fair, but the students should do their experiment at home. The students have picked topics, please ask them what they chose. Help determine if you will have supplies- the question is due January 24th. After that, no changes may be made. We will have check points and days where we make sure we're on track and to go over the next parts- those dates are still to come.

In Phy-Ed we are working on cooperatives and will start Racquetball soon. In Music, we are working on world music.

In Art this week, our project is 100 Meter Dash Grid Drawing and our sketches are Combine two animals into one and Dinosaur Crying.
