Questions for Dayne Kopfer

- 1. You are currently a sophomore at Martin Luther College, studying for the teaching ministry. How did you reach a decision to go in that direction? Link to Your Library

Last month I mentioned some Dewey decimal numbers. The Dewey decimal system is simply an organizational tool that allows a library to shelve items grouped by topic (it is the same system used by the Columbus public

library). Since religious books fall into the 200s in the Dewey

system, Zion's collection falls almost entirely within 200 - 299, but you can use the shelf labels to help differentiate devotion books from Bible studies, church history from biographies, etc. The librarian's phone number is listed near the check out area, so feel free to call or text if you need assistance or have a request.

These items were recently added to our collection: Clearly Christian: Following Jesus in this Age of Confusion (230), Will the Real Jesus Please Stand Up? (232), Being Lutheran: Living in the Faith You Have Received (248.4), Hope When Your Heart Breaks: Navigating Grief and Loss (248.86), Echo: Unbroken Truth Worth Repeating Again (Teen 230.41), and Because Jesus (Teen 248.83).



Principal Reduction - IT'S GOING DOWN


By God's grace and through your generous commitments to the Foundation for Our Future campaign, we have <u>again</u> been able to make a significant reduction in our church mortgage with American Bank. Our campaign was focused on raising enough funds to eliminate our mortgage of \$1.7 million dollars. We are happy to report that we were able to make <u>another</u> \$100,000 reduction in principal this month. Along with the regular payments we have been making since the campaign began, our balance is now just over \$1.4 million.

Sufficient funds have been kept in reserve in the building fund to ensure that we have the monies necessary to make our bimonthly payments. In addition, funds have been kept in reserve to cover the cost of improving the quality of sound in the church. Also, since the voters decided to use money from the building fund to pay any unusual repairs that are needed on the school, a reasonable amount was held in reserve in case they are needed for this as well.

The building fund balance will be continued to be monitored and as is prudent, additional amounts will be used to reduce the principal of the church mortgage in addition to our regular payments.

Thanks be to our Lord for his generous gifts that allow us to reciprocate by contributing to the funding of the campaign.
