

In extreme cases,

- The Aggressive Behaviors Rubric will be followed for major student to student incidences.

The teacher reserves the right to issue an "on the spot" or creative punishment that fits the offense. (i.e. extra work, cleaning, etc.) Consequences are carried out in love and concern for the student. Graciously, God has forgiven all our sins and not one of them is counted against us.

MY MANAGEMENT PHILOSPHY
